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California Building Industry Association Announces Support for Proposition 1

Sacramento, CA – The <u>California Building Industry Association (CBIA)</u> today announced its support of Proposition 1, a \$6.38 billion bond measure aimed at addressing California's homelessness crisis by providing housing and care to Californians with serious mental health and substance use disorders.

"CBIA supports Proposition 1 and applauds Governor Gavin Newsom for championing this important measure which is necessary for California to achieve Housing for All," said Dan Dunmoyer, President and CEO of CBIA. "Proposition 1 will provide critically needed housing for families, veterans and individuals experiencing homelessness. It will also provide much needed behavioral health services for those suffering from mental health and/or substance abuse disorders that often impact housing stability."

If approved, Proposition 1, the Behavioral Health Services Program and Bond Measure, will issue \$6.380 billion in bonds alongside the statutory changes to the Mental Health Services Act. The proceeds from the bond issue would be allocated as follows:

- \$1.05 billion for permanent supportive housing for homeless veterans who have mental health or substance abuse disorders,
- \$922 million to fund permanent supportive housing for people experiencing or at risk of homelessness and have behavioral health needs; and
- \$4.393 billion for grants for behavioral health treatment and housing eligible under the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program.

Proposition 1 will be on California's March 5, 2024 ballot. For more information, please visit treatmentnottents.com.
