Live Wildfire Demonstration Conducted at PCBC 2024

Student Interns Build Structures to Show How Mitigations
Help Reduce Homes' Wildfire Risk

Anaheim, California – July 8, 2024 – Researchers from the <u>Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety</u> (IBHS) in conjunction with the <u>California Building Industry Association</u> (CBIA) conducted a live wildfire demonstration during CBIA's annual <u>Pacific Coast Builders Conference</u> (PCBC 2024).

Approximately 150 homebuilders and suppliers, student interns, fire safety professionals, and others watched how a system of science-based mitigations can meaningfully reduce a home's wildfire risk. The mitigated structure showed the protection provided by noncombustible building materials and a noncombustible five-foot buffer also known as Zone 0.

A noncombustible Zone 0 is critical to prevent ember attack, the leading cause of ignitions during wildfires and one of three key vulnerable areas identified by IBHS's <u>Wildfire Prepared Home</u>TM. California homeowners can reduce a home's wildfire risk by achieving a Wildfire Prepared Home designation.

Student interns from the North Orange County Regional Occupational Program <u>Building Industry Technology Academy</u> (BITA) network constructed side-by-side structures to compare mitigated vs. typical construction and landscaping. They also constructed an additional mitigated structure displayed at the Anaheim Convention Center for PCBC 2024. The Donald Chaiken BITA curriculum is part of the <u>California Homebuilding Foundation</u> and provided at no cost to California schools as an approved Career Technical Education program.

Fittingly, the PCBC 2024 Exhibit Floor featured many wildfire resiliency solutions.
